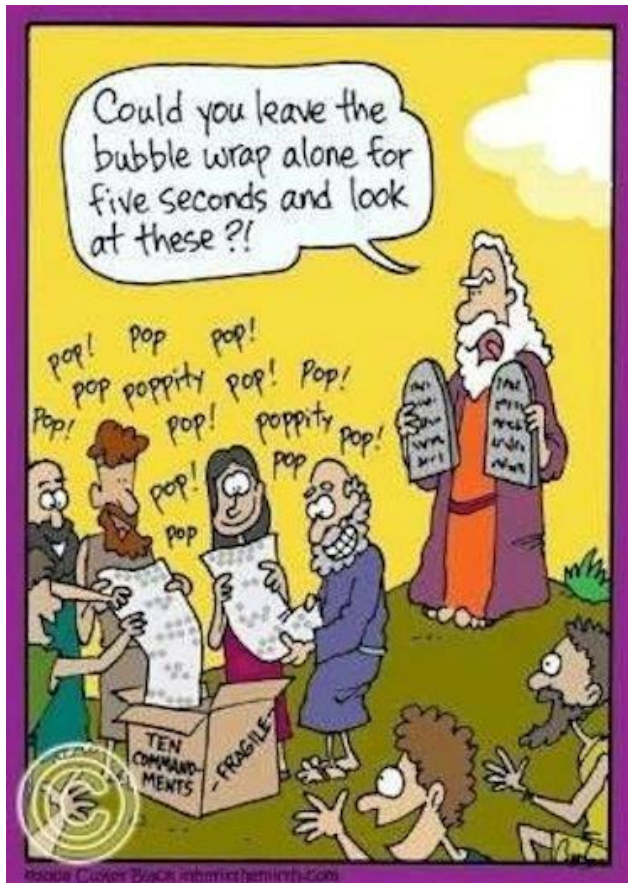

Spiritual Director's Corner

Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope this message finds you well. As we move into and through the summer months, I am reminded of the calling of Matthew (Matthew 9: 9-13). In case you are unfamiliar with the scripture, the text reads:

Matthew 9:9-13 - The Calling of Matthew

9 As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. "Follow me," he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him.

10 While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and sinners came and ate with him and his disciples. 11 When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

12 On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. 13 But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.'^[a] For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."

Just think about the situation. Jesus walks up to Matthew and simply says "follow me". Consider the level of courage and faith in Jesus that he had to simply follow him. As we consider our actions as members of the Mid-Michigan Emmaus Community, and as disciples of Christ, we need to remember that as we are seeking to be servant leaders in the Mid-Michigan Emmaus Community and our own local churches, we need to have the courage to be servant leaders and we need to have faith in Jesus to lead us.



We hope you will meet up at our gatherings as they get posted and enjoy the treasure of fun fellowship, good food, and being on fire for Jesus as we worship too! Here is a quick overview of MME* events for our New Members:

- The monthly gatherings are for all Emmaus Community Members and their families. You can bring a friend. These move to different areas each month and they are held on the **second Friday of each month.**
- Board Meetings are for Emmaus Community Members who have been on a walk and are interested in the board meetings. The board meets at Aldersgate Church in Midland on the **2nd Thursday of each month.** Feel free to join us.
- The Walk Trainings are for the Community members serving on the teams (part-time or full-time team members should attend them).
- The Saturday Candlelight services are for Emmaus Community Members who have been on a walk (not for those who haven't taken a walk yet, or children, as it can be confusing to them and spur mixed emotions when they see their parent but cannot take them home that night)
- The Post-Walk Gatherings are for all community members, and they can bring spouses, children, and friends. Carpooling adds to the fellowship! These are held **after each set of walks in the spring and fall.**

Sponsorship – The Backbone of Our Community

Dear Community,

As summer gets into full swing, I would like to keep our thoughts focused on the fall walks. They will be here before we know it. Our Fall Lay directors are busy putting together their teams for fall. Soon trainings will be starting. With all the preparation going into the teams we need to get moving on sponsorship and pilgrim registrations as well. At the last gathering we did some sponsorship training. Many asked if I could include “The Ten Key Points of Sponsorship” in this month’s newsletter. So here they are:

1. Begin with prayer – Good quality sponsorship is critical to the success of the walks. It is important to seek God’s guidance in who he would have you sponsor. Remember it is not in our timing but God’s timing as to when someone should go on a walk.
2. Meet with the candidate and their spouse – Emmaus encourages couples to go on the same set of walks, but it is not essential that they do. However, it is vital that both the pilgrim and their spouse are both on board and both understand how long the weekend is, what will be presented at the weekend, and when they will return home. Husband and wife attending the same set of walks can really add new strength to a marriage.
3. Always be open and honest about what happens on a weekend. There is no need to hide anything from them, nothing is secret. It is always better to be open and honest.
4. Help them fill out the forms – The Pilgrim forms can be a little intimidating, so sit down with your pilgrim and help them fill out the form and answer any questions that may arise. Try to get couples to go together or at least commit to the next set of walks. Paying the fee for your pilgrim is a really nice agape gift for your pilgrim and is a great way to pay it forward. Never let finances stand in the way of someone wanting to go on a weekend. If someone does not have the funds to go and you are not able to help them, contact your church or reach out to the Emmaus Board and we will make sure they can attend.
5. Agape letters - Pray and prepare 8 to 12 Agape letters from friends and family. Once your forms are received by the registrar, they will send the sponsor a letter with the details you need to accomplish this task.
6. Support your pilgrim – You can support your pilgrim by signing up for the prayer vigil, bringing them to the weekend, attending sponsors hour after send off, attending Saturday night candlelight, and of course attend closing and give your pilgrim a ride home.
7. Communication – Allow time for your pilgrim to talk about their weekend and help them get connected with a 4th day group in your area or consider helping them start a new 4th day group.
8. Growth – Encourage your pilgrims spiritual growth and development by helping them with a daily reading plan, or daily devotional, or help them find a bible study group.
9. Connect - Help your pilgrim get engaged in the Emmaus community by taking them to the post walk gathering as well as other gatherings. Encourage them to sign up to serve on future walks.
10. Sponsor – Finally help your pilgrim to find someone to sponsor for the next set of walks. This is a great way to stay connected and active in the Emmaus community.

A good sponsor will also help find a way to take away roadblocks so the pilgrim can attend the weekend. Things like taking care of a pet. Picking up the pilgrim's mail or even picking up or dropping off their children for sporting events or school. Anything that will calm their minds and help them focus on the weekend.

Finally, don't force anyone to go on a weekend. Many times, we are ready for them to go and they are not. Don't badger someone, when the time is right, God will open their hearts and the doors for them to attend.
